Running theme for this game in all its aspect is the simplicity and minimalism to its design. The controls are simple, the music and sound are dialed back and the design is kept uninspiring with the odd splash of color from red alarms. Dont be fooled by the amount of hours here, I played hundreds of hours on Android, and I still want to play more, there is still content I havent been able to explore. And, here on PC, the gameplay is even better.

. This game, overall, could use some work.

There's no option for "Windowed" mode, no changing the display size, no save button, no menu to change volume, mute sounds, language, turn off animations or hide the reset button.

There's also no instructions on how to play. I didn't realize there was a safe way of exiting the game, until I accidentally pressed ESC, which brought up a simple [x] and play button. So, I'd advise adding a tutorial somewhere.

These would improve the quality of the game and make it pleasurable.

It's intense for a clicker because of how high the goals are set.

I believe the beginning cards are outrageously expensive, considering how much you need to gain momentum. I'm afraid of closing the game manually. I don't want to lose my progress, considering it's taken me four hours so far. I'm no where near done, either. I only just purchased 100 of the first and second cards. I'm hoping to reach the 100K and 100KK achievements, but they seem so far away. They seem a little extreme, given how casual it's supposed to be.

With it being set at \$0.49 USD (on sale) right now, I shouldn't have expected much. You get what you pay for.. You really shouldn't judge this game because of it's graphics because graphics sometimes don't matter if the game plays well, and this game does. Loot or Die is actually alot of fun when you start progressing through the game, especially with friends. The controls are easy to use and feel good and defeating a boss is rewarding. If you like side scrolling shooters you should definitely give this game a try.. I enjoyed my time with this game. I wasnt too familiar with the rules of Golf before playing this but the Golfing is pretty simplistic. I liked the way the charcter stats affect your golf game. it plays like an action RPG. there are some secrets to be found I found a few of them but I suspect not all of them.
